

Data Updates to CERC DataFinder®

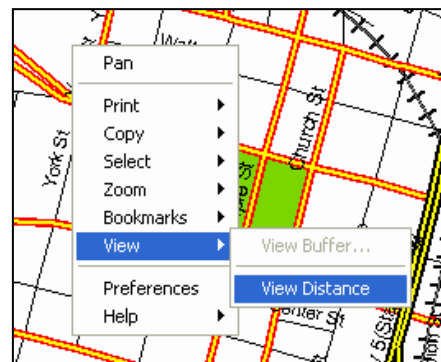
All of the standard data supplied by Applied Geographic Systems was just updated so that the current year estimates are for 2008 and the projections reach to 2013. The data from the 1990 and 2000 Censuses remain so that longer-term comparisons can be made.

Which Connecticut municipality has the largest population in 2008?	<u>Bridgeport</u>
Which Connecticut municipality has the highest median income in 2008?	<u>Weston</u>
Which Connecticut municipality has the highest median age in 2008?	<u>Salisbury</u>

Q: How can I calculate distances?

A: To have DataFinder calculate the distance of a road on the map, right-click with the mouse, select "View" and then "View Distance." Your mouse arrow will then have a symbol next to it that looks like: ▶◀.

Move your mouse to the starting point on the map and left-click once. If you want to change the direction of the distance calculation at an intersection, just left-click once. A yellow box shows "Distance" (the length since your last left-click) and the "Total" (the total length since the beginning of the calculation). To end using this tool, simply double-click.
