

### Town Profiles To Be Updated Within CERC DataFinder®

Last week the CERC Town Profiles available within DataFinder were updated. The update allows DataFinder users to access the current edition (November 2005) of the Town Profiles through the online product. To access the Town Profiles, simply select a town or group of towns in the Geography Selection. Once you complete your selection, the next screen allows you to download the Profile in a PDF format, as seen in the graphic below.
